Shipwrecked!

When we are shipwrecked, Jesus rescues. This was the theme for Cathedral's 2018 Vacation Bible School. This year the cafeteria and school classrooms were transformed into a "deserted" island were everyone participating in Vacation Bible School was shipwrecked after a storm. For the entire week, over thirty children from pre-K 3 to sixth grade, pretended to be castaways on this island. We were stranded with a torn sail. To get "off" this imaginary island, we had to fix the sail's holes. On the first day the children discovered that the only way to "fix" our torn sail was to discover God in their world through "God Sightings." With each God Sighting a patch of cloth was found and used to mend a hole in the sail.

Each day the children were encouraged to find God, while exploring five different stations on the island. The five stations (Faith, Games, Crafts, Music and Snack), were led by a talented team of volunteers who shared their time, talent and faith with all the children. At the Faith station this year the castaways encountered



Jesus, Martha, Mary, Peter, and John. During their time in Games, the children played with rescue rings, water balloons, and sponge balls. The children created worry stones, decoder bracelets and floating islands at the Crafts area. They ate apple boats, lifesaver cupcakes and rescue map cheese sticks during their time at the Snack shack. "Never Let Go of Me" and "Won't Worry 'Bout a Thing" became two of the popular songs learned at the Music station. These are just a few of the many faith-filled exciting moments found throughout VBS this year.



The "castaway" children learned that Jesus will rescue them during times of loneliness, worry, struggle, wrong-doing, and powerlessness. These five areas were highlighted and examined during the week. Through personal stories, discussions, songs and fun, the children experienced that Jesus rescues with love and care. We were indeed blessed with many God Sightings and were able to sail away on Friday.

In an effort to give back to the community and show Jesus' caring, throughout the week the children collected non-perishable food items for the Holy Family Food Pantry. The goal was to fill a small pool with 75 items to be donated on Friday. Not only did we meet this goal by Thursday, we were able to exceed it by 57 items. This made our food donation total 132 items!!!!

This year at VBS we were blessed by the presence of seminarian Dominic Vahling. Dominic noticed that the Psalm on the Sunday post-VBS worked perfectly with the "Shipwrecked" theme. He said,

The Responsorial Psalm that the Church prayed the Sunday after VBS was Psalm 30. The response should be familiar to us: "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me." The Psalm goes on to describe what the Lord rescues us from; he saves us from "the netherworld" and "from going down into the pit." This is the most basic reason for being a Christian: God loves us, and wants us to be with him forever in heaven. The final line of our psalm was "O Lord my God, forever will I give you thanks." This is a proper response to God's gift of rescuing us from sin!

As fun and exciting as VBS is to plan, create and execute each year, it would not be possible without the help of many, many people. The CCCW and the Knights of Columbus Council support VBS monetarily each year. Several parishioners help organize, design, decorate, and staff the various VBS areas. Current and former SHG students help decorate, coordinate and lead many of the activities. John Paul Kessler researched and portrayed a patron saint every day.
